Friends:

As most of you know, I announced from the pulpit on Sunday, April 30, that I have accepted a new appointment to serve Mt. Zion United Methodist in Highland, Maryland.

I have shared with the SPPRC (Staff/Pastor/Parish Relations Committee) and the leadership of the church that this transition comes at the right time for me and for the church. I've been greatly blessed to have served as your pastor at Hunt's for nine years. We have accomplished many things and I've witnessed the evidence of your strong faith and commitment to missions. You are a gifted, talented congregation! I hope you have learned from me as much as I have learned from you.

The writer of Ecclesiastes wrote: "To everything there is a season." As your pastor, I have served here for a significant season. Now it's time for Hunt's to begin a new season. Your new pastor will bring new ideas, new ways of looking at things, and he will offer a new vision for a shared ministry. On Sunday, May 5th, the chair of the SPPRC, Becky Pauliny, informed the congregation that your new pastor will be Rev. Travis Knoll. (Please read his letter which is included in this edition of the newsletter.) He will begin his ministry on July 1st and his first Sunday in the pulpit will be July 2nd. I know that you will give him and his family a warm welcome and that you will support his leadership as he begins a new season of ministry.

When I had my first meeting with the folks at Mt. Zion, we met in a room with a painting on the wall that I readily recognized. It's a painting by British painter, Alford Usher Soord (1868-1915), *The Parable Of The Lost Sheep*. The painting depicts a sheep stranded halfway down a steep cliff and the shepherd hanging perilously over the edge, risking his own life to save it. It should come not as a surprise to you that it's the same painting depicted on the stainedglass window in front of Hunt's sanctuary. It reminded me of my stay at Hunt's; but it also reminded me of a profound truth: that we have the Good Shepherd that is always searching for us to bring us back to the fold of God's love.

Conference Polity for Outgoing Pastors

Below is the policy regarding pastors returning to a previous appointment as specified in the Baltimore Conference Manual on Policies and Procedures.

Paragraph 2412

1. As of the effective date of a new appointment, a pastor shall immediately cease all pastoral counseling and pastoral visitation with members or member families in the previous appointment. Since appointments are generally announced weeks in advance, each pastor has adequate time in which to affect closure and make appropriate referral to another for the pastoral care of members.

2. Pastors shall have a clear understanding with former congregations that they will not return to officiate at baptisms, weddings, and funerals; or do pastoral counseling or pastoral visitation in that parish. Pastor, active or retired, shall respectively decline to participate in such duties when invited by members of a former pastor. Declining all such invitations is the responsibility of the previous pastor. The present pastor, at his or her discretion, may invite the previous pastor to return for pastoral functions. However, the present pastor should never be under any pressure to invite the previous pastor.

3. Several weeks prior to concluding a pastoral appointment, a pastor shall inform all members of the church of this policy by printing sections 1 and 2 verbatim in either a pastoral letter to be sent to each member or a church newsletter to be sent to each member and encourage them to support the policy by their prayers and actions.






Meet the Knolls

Pictured on the right are Travis and Sarah at Cunningham Falls.

Travis was born in a US Army hospital in Italy and moved a lot as a child. Eventually, his family settled in Maryland when he was 11, and have been here ever since.

As wandering nomads, the first thing Travis' parents did after moving in was to find a Methodist Church to be in whenever the doors were open. Travis's parents, Jerry and Rachael, directed



the children's choir (so guess who got to be in it?) led the youth group (ditto), taught Sunday School, directed the 8 am adult choir, taught in-home Bible Studies (guess who got to recruit friends to attend?) and other church activities.

In 9th grade Travis had a biology teacher who was a devout atheist who taught that science proved that God does not exist (using Occam's Razor). Consultation with his guidance counselor taught Travis that he would "outgrow" his childish need for religion. Those experiences led to 6 years of study and soul searching at the end of which Travis decided it was possible to remain a Christian and not check your brain at the door. Thus far, at least, his guidance counselor has been in error. Travis has served as a local church pastor in a variety of churches for 21 years after a stint as a computer programmer under contract to NASA.

Sarah currently works at Harford Community College as a studio aide in the Ceramics and Sculpture Studio. She also creates her own work, which is sold at local art shows, the Riverview Gallery in Havre de Grace, and in her etsy shop, www.etsy.com/skpottery. Her first career was in graphic design, and she has done various volunteer stints, including two summers as a Square Supervisor on an archaeological dig near Amman, Jordan. Sarah has also been an active volunteer with the Boy Scouts.

Dean is the oldest of the three talented and brilliant boys. Dean graduated from Towson University with a degree in Computer Science and is actively seeking employment in that field.

Caleb, the middle son, is an Eagle Scout, a mechanical engineer student at UMBC, and is presently working as a climbing wall instructor at the Catonsville YMCA.

Lewis, the youngest, is a student at Fallston High School who runs track, hopes to make the soccer team, and favors Liverpool FC in the British Premier League. He is also very active in his Boy Scout troop.

The Auxiliary of BCC is an organization of volunteers and supporters from across the Baltimore-Washington UMC Conference who share the love of Christ with the children and families served by the BCC, which provides residential services, group homes, a school, treatment foster care, outpatient mental health

There are innumerable activities that the Auxiliary performs all year. Some are shortterm, as short as a few hours, to larger/longer commitments; some can be done at Hunt's whereas others at their BCC campus in Randallstown. Volunteers are always needed.

One of their myriad of projects is the collection and redemption of Box Tops for Education. The final Hunt's Box Tops total delivered in May was 1,106 points, worth \$110.60. (Thanks to Nell Kirby for clipping and counting most of the Box Tops.) Hunt's as one church represents 0.25% of the churches; however, annually, we probably provided 4-5% of the total collected by BCC! Thank you and keep up the Good Work!

We went to the annual BCC Auxiliary meeting on May 11. We noticed that on the agenda for Musical Selection was the FEBC Children's Choir from Seoul Korea, which is part of a Christian broadcast ministry. We assumed that it would be a video presentation; consequently, we were surprised when over 40 children (aged 8-14?) came in and sang in perfect English several selections and hymns. One reason they were touring the US was in appreciation



of the USA support for the safety of South Korea. They were "angelic." During their encore, the children went out into the audience giving us all hugs and thanking and blessing us; there were not very many dry eyes in the audience.


