2) Donations for our five sponsored children overseas via ChildFund International -





December's "Casserole Ministry's Recipe"

BAKED ZITI CASSEROLE

Ingredients:


pound dry ziti pasta
 onion, chopped
 pound lean ground beef
 (26 ounce) jars spaghetti sauce
 ounces provolone cheese, sliced
 cups sour cream
 ounces mozzarella cheese, shredded
 tablespoons grated parmesan cheese



Directions:

- 1. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add ziti pasta, and cook until al dente, about 8 minutes; drain.
- 2. In a large skillet, brown onion and ground beef over medium heat. Add spaghetti sauce, and simmer 15 minutes.
- 3. Butter a 9 x 13 inch baking dish. Layer as follows: ½ of the ziti, provolone cheese, sour cream, ½ sauce mixture, remaining ziti, mozzarella cheese and remaining sauce mixture. Top with grated parmesan cheese.
- 4. Cover and freeze.
