Baked Ziti Casserole

Ingredients

- 1 pound dry ziti pasta
- 1 onion, chopped
- 1 pound lean ground beef or ground turkey
- 2 (26 ounce) jars spaghetti sauce
- 6 ounces provolone cheese, sliced
- 1 1/2 cups sour cream
- 6 ounces mozzarella cheese, shredded
- 2 tablespoons grated Parmesan cheese

Directions

- 1. Bring a large pot of lightly salted water to a boil. Add ziti pasta, and cook until al dente, about 8 minutes; drain.
- 2. In a large skillet, brown onion and ground beef or turkey medium heat. Add spaghetti sauce, and simmer 15 minutes.
- 3. Butter or spray with Pam a 9 x13 inch baking dish. Layer as follows: 1/2 of the ziti, Provolone cheese, sour cream, 1/2 sauce mixture, remaining ziti, mozzarella cheese and remaining sauce mixture. Top with grated Parmesan cheese.
- 4. Freeze or cook in oven preheated to 350 for about 30 minutes.

Label:



- Let defrost in the fridge for 24 hours.
- <u>Bake in an oven preheated to 350 for</u> about 30 minutes, or until cheeses are melted.

Ingredients: Spaghetti Sauce, Ground Beef or Turkey, Ziti pasta, Provolone, Mozzarella and Parmesan Cheeses, Chopped onion.

RECAP OF 2015 BALTIMORE COUNTY CHRISTIAN WORKCAMP (BCCW)

Quick overall summary:

Sunday July 19—We had our last planning meeting to get ready for the week's events. Afterwards, we had our kick-off dinner at Hunt's (an estimated 105-115 in attendance), showed our 40-minute orientation video, and closed our silent auction.



Monday July 20—Hunt's prepared scrambled eggs and bacon for the 50-55 volunteers who came for our 7:30 breakfast at Hunt's. Bagged lunches were prepared and then we headed off to our sites. At 6:30 some of us went to a host church which prepared dinner for us where we recapped the day's activities.

Tuesday July 21 thru Friday July 24—Basically the same as Monday, except on each day, there was a different church which prepared the breakfast (50-55 attendees each morning) at Hunt's and a different church which hosted the dinner. Friday's dinner included a video of the sites' photographs through Thursday, discussion of what occurred during the week at the sites, awards, and a closing communion service.

During the week, 29 sites were completed; 9 were partially done; 7 were not visited. 11 of 13 ramps were completed.

Weather summary:

Monday—HOT, HUMID, and MISERABLE!!! (but at least no rain)

Tuesday—Not as bad as Monday's, but still not that good (but, still no rain).

Wednesday thru Friday-Still warm, but decent for mid-July (and no rain).





The first site (no shade!) was in the Windsor Mill area off Rolling Road. Our productivity due to the weather (See comment above.) was low (65%?) and several volunteers had to leave early due to the heat. Notwithstanding, we manually dug and used a two-person gasoline powered-auger to drill some of our post holes, purchased the necessary lumber, and got our ramp and landings started. Tuesday morning, Steve Lippy recruited some non-Hunt's people to help us as we were behind schedule; we completed all but the last ramp tread and the railings on Tuesday. One of the new persons actually had used an auger before and was a great addition to the team. Tuesday night, as well as on Wednesday morning, Steve Lippy recruited some more non-Hunt's volunteers, as the extra help from Tuesday was not coming back. Unfortunately, our crew chief, Glenn Keatts, faced a major dilemma early on Wednesday morning as he needed to go the hospital since his father took a turn for the worse, essential tools were on his pick-up truck and his trailer was needed to transport lumber for the next ramp site. He took a **MAJOR** leap of faith and dropped off his truck keys to someone to give to Steve so we could use his truck and trailer. Fortunately, one person recruited the night before had experience with driving a pick-up truck, as well as pulling a trailer. (Steve did emphasize driving safely and keeping it clean and organized!) We then went to the first site and finished the ramp about noon (a 6'x6' porch landing, two 3'x3' landings and 35' of ramp). Afterwards, we then went to the second site which was in Pikesville (shaded by some large trees) where we ate lunch, began augering holes, picked up some of the lumber for the ramp, and set a few posts. A few other non-Hunt's persons were recruited for Thursday. Glenn was able to work Thursday morning and all day Friday. We were hustling on Friday afternoon (including ripping needed 2x4s out of extra 2x6s) and finished at 6:00 pm when the owner brought her mother down the ramp (a 4'x4' wedge at the front door, a 3'x3' and 3'x6' landing, and 60' of ramp).

A few photographs of the Hunt's breakfast crew and the finished two ramps are on the Missions bulletin board; additional photographs are on Hunt's website (<u>www.huntsumc.org</u>). (We have requested a video which will show most of the photos from "our" two sites.)



Eleven Hunt's members gave an estimated 36 $\frac{1}{2}$ work days at the two "Hunt's sites," as well as two days at another site by one person.

"Hunt's two ramp sites" are in parentheses on purpose for though we (i.e., Glenn and Steve) committed to Hunt's building the two ramps, if we had not the additional help on the four days, we would not have finished both. Their completion was a result of a collaborative effort; we are most grateful for the assistance by others.





And last, but certainly, not least, THANK YOU to all of those who participated in some way to make the BCCW a success!:

- For all those who donated monies for the Advent and Lent offerings, and special donations (including \$2,000 from the Carroll-Gills Endowment Fund)—a total of \$4,108.50.
- For those who donated gift cards for the silent auction (at least five), baked goods for the auction, baked goods for lunch, books for the used book sale, and items for the flea market.
- For those who helped set up tables and chairs on Sunday morning.
- For those who assisted Jody Waters (who had purchased the food) in preparing the Monday breakfast (Robin Bosley, Lynn Henss, Mary Ellen Lippy, and Pegg Melfa).
- For those who participated in the silent auction.
- For those who actually worked at any of the work sites during the week (especially on "miserable" Monday!): Carol Anders, Pat Barkdoll, Bruce Douglas, Dan Funderburk, Glenn and Linda Keatts, Steve Lippy, Diane Paulson, Melissa Regan, Gary Sheffield-James, and Robert Sparks. (Special thanks go to Glenn for allowing us the once-in-a-lifetime opportunity of using his truck and trailer without him, as well as to several people who decided to work more days than originally anticipated.)
- For Howard Linn who was one of BCCW's photographers (who did seem to show a partiality to "our" two sites) and attended all of the breakfasts and dinners and racked up over 500 miles driving to the sites throughout the County.

<u>2016 BCCW</u>—On Friday night the question was posed and everyone unanimously proclaimed that there should indeed be a 33rd annual BCCW; at our 2015 wrap-up planning meeting on August 11, we confirmed that and set the date as <u>July 17-22, 2016</u>.

- Bride and Groom Celebrate Nuptials by Serving Syrian Refugees in Turkish Soup Kitchen





- What about the clean pew cushions or refinished side door or repairs to the flagstone sidewalk?


