This past massive winter storm called Jonas seemed to be appropriately named.



In the King James of Version the Bible, the word "Jonas" is used to Jonah. refer to Jonah is the prophet who God calls to go to the city of Nineveh and

preach a message of repentance. Jonah chooses however to travel in the opposite direction, boarding a boat that will take him as far away from Nineveh as possible. (It's important for us who read this story to understand that Nineveh is a place of foreigners and is considered enemy territory, and to know that Jonah's reluctance stems from his intense hatred for them.)

For those who are familiar with the story, we know that Jonah does not get very far in his attempt to run away from God's call. Soon a great storm arises on the



sea and the crew quickly blames Jonah for their plight. They decide to throw him overboard; whereupon Jonah is swallowed by a large fish. Due to this great storm and being swallowed by a large fish, Jonah grudgingly decides to travel to the place that he desires not to visit. In the end, Jonah preaches God's message and the Ninevites repent. The story reminds us that God's grace can't be thwarted by a reluctant,

prejudice-ridden prophet. In a real sense, the story ends with a great storm brewing inside Jonah's soul. He must now decide on how he will respond to a God of extravagant grace.

Well, the storms of life, whether such storms rage from within or from the outside, often force us to find clarity about what is important in life. How did you occupy your time during the history breaking blizzard of 2016? It's amazing how this one event affected the lives of 60 million people. The traffic flow was practically non-existent.





<u>December/January Report</u> – THANK YOU to the congregation for your support and donations:

- 1 Seventeen casseroles in December and 12 in January for our Casserole Ministry. These go to people at:
 - Martha's Place transitional housing for women coming out of drug treatment and addiction
 - The JACQUES Initiative at the University of Maryland Hospital, a program with a holistic care model that provides long-term treatment for people infected with HIV
 - Earl's Place housing and supportive services for men who were formerly homeless
- 2 \$747 for the Advent Special Offering.

This offering supports both the summer Sr. High Youth Group mission to repair homes in Western Maryland during Camp Hope and the Baltimore County Christian Workcamp during which homes are repaired throughout Baltimore County.

- 3 Several dozens of homemade cookies for the Earl's Place Resolution Run
 Earl's Place, in Baltimore, is a home for 17 men at a time who are recovering from substance abuse and trying to get their lives back together. Their annual Resolution Run on Jan. 1 is a fund raiser.

Emeril Lagasse's Better Than Mama's Chili Mac

- **Yield:** 6 to 8 servings
- Use 1 9 X 13 casserole or cut recipe in half to use an 8 X 8 dish.

Ingredients:

- 2 teaspoons olive oil
- 2 medium onions small diced, about 3 cups
- 2 jalapenos, stemmed and minced, optional
- 1 tablespoon salt, plus more for pasta cooking water
- 2 pounds extra lean ground beef Note: You may use ground turkey or ½ turkey and ½ beef.
- 5 tablespoons Mexican chili powder
- 1 tablespoon oregano
- 2 tablespoons minced garlic
- 1 (28 ounce) can whole plum tomatoes, broken with your hands, with juices
- 2 cans kidney beans, drained
- 1 pound elbow macaroni
- 1 pound medium cheddar cheese

Directions

- Heat olive oil over medium-high heat in a 6-quart soup pot. Add onions, jalapenos (if desired), and 2 teaspoons of the salt and cook until soft, 2 minutes. Add ground beef, chili powder, oregano, and garlic and cook, breaking up any clumps of meat with a spoon, for 5 minutes. Add tomatoes, beans, and 1/2 cup of water, stir, and bring chili to a boil. Reduce heat to a simmer and cook until thickened to chili consistency, about 20 minutes. Taste and add 1 more teaspoon salt, if needed.
- While the chili is simmering, cook macaroni according to package directions in boiling salted water, drain in a colander, rinse under cool running water and set aside.
- Grate cheddar cheese and set aside.
- Spray a 9 x 13.5-inch or other 3-quart casserole dish.
- Once chili has finished cooking, fold in the cooked macaroni and 1/3 of the cheddar cheese. Transfer chilimac to the baking dish and top with remaining cheese.
- Wrap and freeze.
- To bake: Defrost in refrigerator overnight. Bake in a preheated 400° oven until heated through and cheese is melted, 10-20 minutes. Remove from oven and let cool 5 minutes before serving.

Better Than Mama's Chili Mac

Ingredients: olive oil, onions, salt, ground beef or ground turkey, chili powder, oregano, garlic, tomatoes, kidney beans, elbow macaroni, cheddar cheese.

To bake: Defrost in refrigerator overnight. Bake in a preheated 400° oven until heated through and cheese is melted, 10-20 minutes. Put a sheet pan beneath in case the cheese overflows. Remove from oven and let cool 5 minutes before serving.

Chicken and Rice Casserole with Chiles, Corn and Black Beans

Yield: One 13" x 9" casserole, serves 8

Ingredients:

Topping: 4 oz. corn chips, 2 T. butter, 2T. minced parsley.

Casserole:

4 T. (1/2 stick) unsalted butter

2 medium bell peppers – red, green, yellow or mixed, seeded, and chopped

1 medium onion, chopped 1 small can of green chiles OR chopped jalapeno peppers

3 medium garlic cloves, minced or pressed through garlic press 2 t. ground cumin

¹/₄ cup all-purpose flour 6 cups of chicken broth, low sodium

1 cup heavy cream 1 ½ cups long grain rice

2 pounds boneless, skinless chicken breasts (about 5)

8 ounces shredded pepper jack cheese (about 2cups)

1 15.5 oz. can of black beans, drained and rinsed

1 ½ cups of frozen corn, thawed and well-drained 3 T. lime juice

Ground black pepper, salt and cayenne pepper to taste

- 1. Make the topping by coarsely processing melted butter, corn chips and parsley. Set aside.
- 2. Melt butter in a large Dutch oven over medium heat. Add bell peppers, onions, chiles, and salt. Cook for 8 -10 minutes. Stir in the garlic and cumin and cook another 30 seconds. Stir in the flour and cook stirring constantly until golden about 1 minute. Slowly stir in the broth and cream.
- 3. Add the chicken breasts, bring to a simmer. Reduce heat to low, cover and cook for 10 15 minutes.
- 4. Remove the chicken and set aside to cool.
- 5. Stir in the rice and continue to cook over low heat, stirring often until the rice has absorbed all liquid -about 20 25 minutes.
- 6. Shred the cooled chicken into bit-sized pieces.
- 7. Remove sauce from heat and stir in the chicken, cheese, black beans, corn and lime juice. Season with salt, pepper and cayenne (optional).
- 8. Pour into a 13" x 9" casserole and top with corn chip topping.
- 9. Wrap dish tightly with foil sprayed with cooking spray. Label and freeze for up to 1 month.

Chicken and Rice Casserole with Black Beans, Corn and Green Chiles

Ingredients: Chicken, Rice, Chicken Broth, Cheese, Black Beans, Corn, Green Chiles, Bell Pepper, Cream, Onions, Garlic, Lime Juice, Salt, and Pepper. Cayenne Pepper Optional. Topping: Butter, Corn Chips, and Parsley.

Thaw for 24 hours in the refrigerator.

Pre-heat oven to 400. Cover casserole with foil and bake for 1 hour. Remove foil and bake for another 15 minutes until topping is crisp.

Chicken & Stuffing Casserole (8" x 8" pan & 2" deep)

Ingredients:

- 1 box Stove Top Stuffing (Chicken Flavor)
- 2 boneless Chicken Breasts
- 2 cans Campbell's Chicken Gravy

Morton's "Nature Seasons" seasoning blend

Directions:

Boil chicken breasts (until done). Shred or cut into small pieces. Prepare Stove Top Stuffing (as directed on box)

Spray Pam in casserole dish.


Spread stuffing on bottom of dish

Spread chicken pieces on top of stuffing

Sprinkle "Nature's Seasons" seasoning on top of chicken

Pour gravy over chicken (to cover the chicken)

Cover and freeze.
