Hunt's Church Preschool www.huntschurchpreschool.com Recently I read a column written by a Spiritual Director entitled, "*Your Presence Is A Contribution*." The gist of the article is that being present improves our mental health and deepens our personal growth. The Director goes on to remind us that being in the present is a matter of discipline and intentionality. Her bold declaration is this: "*Your presence matters*! Your presence matters!" She urges us to 'practice presence'.

This article to which I mention is written on the topic of "Self-Care." One of my prayers is this: "God, help me to be present where I am present." If you are like me, then you know that this is not easy for us to do for many reasons. To intentionally 'practice presence' is extremely difficult because each day brings upon us competing demands that require from us an array of various responses. Unforeseen crises arise. The stuff of life interrupts our schedules. Our priorities get re-prioritized. And because we know that life is indeed difficult, then we can fully appreciate how our presence really is a contribution.

The season of Lent in the church is a time of reflection, prayer, reading scripture, and being present to God and others. And we do that by keeping our focus on Jesus. We recall how Jesus serves others and cares for others. We also are aware of how he finds it necessary to get way from others in order to be alone and pray. Over and over again, Jesus shows us the importance of balance; that of being present for others and how that is connected to being present to God.


The last week of Jesus' earthly life is called Holy Week. It begins with Palm Sunday and ends with the glory of the Resurrection. It's important to note that we can't separate the Resurrection from the importance of Palm Sunday. On Palm Sunday, Jesus enters Jerusalem. Jesus shows up. He is present in body, mind, and spirit. With courage and firm resolve, he is present to confront the powers of injustice, hate, and oppression that seek to reign by intimidation and threat of death. Jesus shows up and is present even when at the end of week many abandon his cause. Jesus is present even when his own disciples desert him. Jesus is present with God and others even on the cross when he says, "*Forgive them for they do not know what they do.*"

Jesus shows up for us. Will we show up for him? In this election year, I am reminded of the story of a local politician who lost a close election. The polls indicated beforehand that he would be the likely winner. But that was not to be the case. In his concession speech, he mounted the podium and said, "I would like to acknowledge the support of all those good people who didn't go to the poles."

Jesus showed up on Palm Sunday. And thank God that he did! The good news of Easter is that God's presence of eternal life is both a present reality and a future hope.

Almost a dozen of you spontaneously sent an Email endorsing the idea of a new Pictorial Directory and 9 people met with the representative from LifeTouch (Olan Mills is no longer in business) to explore what they had to offer and what our responsibilities would be. Then the idea was presented to the Church Council for advice and approval. Supportive discussion led to enthusiastic unanimous approval to go forward.

What LifeTouch offers, in general: Professional photograph, 8x10 inches, of each family or single person posing for a portrait FREE with an option to select other poses and sizes for cash. Publication of a new Directory, designed by us and using our church activity pictures (think 'Howard Lin'); and a church roster – GET THIS – which can include 2 phone numbers and 2 email addresses in addition to the usual names, address, and phone. All participants will receive a free Directory.

Our responsibilities are: First to form a volunteer committee to plan and assemble the Directory and Second to engage EACH of you, later, to schedule an appointment (can be done electronically) and sit for a portrait. Our target is 139 portraits. Hunt's Church Preschool's staff & families, friends, neighbors, coworkers, etc. can also participate, but their portraits will not be in the Directory.

Please hasten to prayerfully consider this fun and time-limited opportunity to do something different for the good of us all and LET BETH (our church secretary) KNOW OF YOUR WILLINGNESS TO SERVE.

Broad brush time line is for the committee to meet this spring to plan the publicity campaign and get the tasks lined up and the contract signed. In September hit the ground running with sign-ups for portraits and the selection of pictures and format for the activity section of the Directory. Portraits will be taken by mid-November (yours will be ready before Christmas). After portraits, the committee will have 2 weeks to submit the entire Directory (it can be done sooner) and, later, 1 week to proof-read.

More details and progress to follow.

On a personal note, regretfully, I will not be able to Chair this committee, but will help whenever I am in town.

Trustee's Report

The work of the Trustees continues...

Not long after Ken's retirement, actually within a couple of days, Linda Flavin and I received a telephone call from the Preschool asking us for help with a problem with the heat in Van Metre Hall. It wasn't surprising because it seems like we are always having problems with that system! So Linda Flavin hit the ground running and started on a long journey that finally solved the problem with that heating system that had plagued Church for years! Through many meetings with repair companies and a tremendous amount of research, Linda and a group of the trustees discovered that the source of the problem was not the heating system, but the electric circuit breaker that supplied the heat system. She and her team discovered that the thirty-year-old breaker was no longer manufactured and needed to be replaced. We received so many warning signs from the heat system failures, but we never figured out what the cause of the failures were until now! The breaker panel was replaced and the system runs well now!

Our work on the Choir Room continues. The painting has been completed. We are now moving on to installing a new floor system that will not only be acoustically superior to the carpet that is in there now but also durable and last long into the future. ------Additionally, we are looking for a new piano for the Choir Room. So, if you have a piano that is in good working condition and you would like to donate it to the Church, please let us know and we will gladly move it for you.

Based on the success of the past, our Saturday work days will continue on the third Saturday of the month well into the summer!
