Grace and peace, sisters and brothers in Christ –

I bring you greetings from the great cloud of witnesses that are the UMC, over 12 million strong, and from our fellow believers worldwide, numbering over 2.2 billion. This fall, the body of Christ is in active service attempting to make the world a better place in many, many ways.

As we speak, trained first responders from nearby are in North and South Carolina assessing damage and planning a course to get started on the reconstruction. UMCOR is flooding the area with supplies from flood buckets to building materials, and the work needed to make reconstruction possible is underway already. At the same time, Africa University, an UM seminary and college in Zimbabwe is training future leaders of the church in Africa the skills that they will need to faithfully equip the people of Africa to serve God. Meanwhile, hospitals are being built and staffed, Doctors Without Borders are healing beyond the reach of hospitals, and the church is reaching to the least, the last, and the lost.

How is Hunt's participating in the great work of bringing hope and the gospel to the world? We are doing so in many ways (see the list from last month's newsletter...) and thinking about how to do it even more effectively going forward. Last year on October 22, we held a meeting in which I discovered that it was our strong desire to grow Hunt's congregation going forward. The church's leadership have been thinking, praying, and talking about this ever since.

The fundamental question is summarized in the acronym YBH. This stands for "yes, but how?" This question can sometimes be asked of a sermon, a goal of any kind, or a dream in the mind of a child – for us now: how do we grow?

The best answer I have is that a church grows when its people get excited enough about what is happening to invite their neighbors. That excitement may be triggered by fun events and an expectation of the joyful community, by spiritual growth and transformation, by the encouragement and love of others, or perhaps by some combination of these or other factors. As your pastor, I have been trying to figure out what excites us here at Hunts. Your leadership are also asking this question, and wrestling with its implications.



Please help us spread the word.



Finance Committee Update

As the end of the calendar year approaches, I wanted to provide you information on our financial results. Through the end of August, here is our performance compared to budget:

	Jan-Aug Actual	Jan-Aug Budget	Full Year Budget
Income	\$259,824	\$251,205	\$385,794
Expense	\$263,474	\$267,087	\$407,020
Difference	- \$3,650	- \$15,882	- \$21,226

Income is modestly ahead of budget, due mainly to some generous stock donations at the beginning of the year and better than expected offerings in July and August, while expenses are running close to plan. Thank you for your stewardship so far this year. Please continue to support our church and all of the great work it does as we approach the final quarter of the year.

Some unexpected expenses were incurred in September, so we continue to expect that we will need to dip into our financial reserves, consistent with the budgeted shortfall of just over \$21,000. If you are able to increase your giving, please consider doing so, so these reserves can be maintained for the future. We are an active congregation that provides a multitude of services to the greater community, and all of this is made possible by our strong financial foundation and the love and dedication of our members carrying out God's commandment to "Love Thy Neighbor." Stewardship Season is upon us!

Praise the Lord, it is pledge time again! ② I know that one of the taboo subjects in our culture is money, and it can be hard to hear the pastor ask for more giving. Sometimes it might feel like I am asking for a raise, and you all to sacrifice to generate it. On the other hand, Jesus regularly talked about money, invited its generous giving, and called us to be faithful in this "little thing" that we can be trusted with much more important gifts...

This season we focus our stewardship time on a relatively obscure passage from 1 Chronicles 4 – a very short break-out from the middle of a listing of begats:

.... These were the sons of Naarah. The sons of Helah: Zereth, Izhar, and Ethnan. Koz became the father of Anub, Zobebah, and the families of Aharhel son of Harum. Jabez was honored more than his brothers; and his mother named him Jabez, saying, "Because I bore him in pain." Jabez called on the God of Israel, saying, "Oh that you would bless me and enlarge my border, and that your hand might be with me, and that you would keep me from hurt and harm!" And God granted what he asked.

Chelub the brother of Shuhah became the father of Mehir, who was the father of Eshton. Eshton became the father of

OLD COURT ROAD CLOSURE



General

- The water main in the middle of Old Court Road from Joppa Road to Ruxton Road is to be dug up and replaced with a new water main in the same location.
- This 2-3 month project will necessitate road detours and changes.
- During this period, everyone coming to Hunt's needs to use extra caution and diligence and detour accordingly. Please drive carefully.
- We are expected to have access off Old Court Road to Hunt's at all times from one side or the other.

Monday September 24-Monday October 8 (estimated)

- 1. The initial construction in Old Court Road will **BEGIN** at Joppa Road and proceed west to Ruxton Road.
- 2. Expect Old Court Road to be **CLOSED** to **ALL** traffic between Joppa Road and the Hunt's parking lot starting about 9:00 am on Monday September 24 for approximately two weeks until about October 8.
- 3. During this initial period, <u>ALL</u> traffic <u>TO</u> Hunt's Church and the Agape House should be via Ruxton Road to Old Court Road. This stretch of Old Court Road from Ruxton Road will be open to Local Traffic **Only**.
- 4. Leaving Hunt's parking lot during this period should be via the Joppa Road exit and should be **just right hand turns**, especially during rush hours on Joppa Road. The yellow plastic chain and barrel will need to be removed before anyone departs and they will need to be put back after everyone leaves at the end to avoid unwanted cut-through traffic.

After Monday October 8 (estimated) to the end of the project

- 5. Access to Hunt's will <u>NOT</u> be possible from Ruxton Road. (The work will move west, as well as the complete road closure point to all traffic.) Expect some possible confusion and delayed communication whenever that transition occurs on or about October 8.
- 6. From Joppa Road, there will be Local Traffic <u>Only</u> access on the stretch of Old Court Road to our parking lot. Traffic on Old Court may be suitable for only one-way local traffic.
- 7. Joppa Road exit may be utilized as needed. See #4 above for instructions.

Baltimore County Christian Workcamp - Ramp Fall Project

For those who were away the week of July 15 or the week was too hot and humid, there is another opportunity to assist in building a ramp; of course, anyone who helped this year is also welcomed!

During July, primarily due to not enough work teams, BCCW was not able to build one of the ramps on our listing of possible sites.

Consequently, Glenn volunteered to be the crew chief for this ramp in an effort to get it built this fall. On September 12, both of us visited the site in Dundalk, about 20 miles from Hunt's, not far from our Turner's Station site in July. We need to decide on a design that we believe will work for the individual, get her concurrence, <u>and</u> then get her trailer park management to approve it. One design by someone else had not been approved. Hopefully, we can schedule it to be built in October. Not only should it be much cooler than in July, the location has ample parking, as well as ample room for our set-up.

As a result, we are compiling a list of potential volunteers who may be interested in helping us build the ramp, depending on the date(s) chosen. After receiving management approval, we will tentatively schedule two consecutive days a week or so in advance. However, we would be watching the weather forecasts and would not make a final determination until the evening before, which would still be predicated on good weather the next morning.

Therefore, if you would be interested in possibly helping either one or both days and wish to be kept informed of our scheduled work dates, let Glenn or me know via email, telephone, or over donut holes, etc. This is **not** a commitment on your part as we recognize that the days finally chosen may not be suitable for you. Consequently, we are hoping to have a much larger pool of possible volunteers than we need as we know not all would be available for the days finally chosen. We would not be looking for a "commitment" until we schedule the dates. If we need to re-schedule, any "commitment" is "null and void," as we would start the process again. If, in the unlikely event (but gratifying) that we have too many volunteers for the scheduled date(s), we would contact the volunteers to see who would like a day(s) off from volunteering. (Note--We are assuming two work days, based on an adequate number of volunteers and no adverse weather interruptions; otherwise, it would take longer.)

We have reached out to other BCCW workcampers too.
