

Moment in Time...Sunday, June 18, 1933

On Sunday, June 18, 1933, Hunt's congregation viewed for the first time its newly installed stained-glass window... "The Lost Sheep". A devastating fire just four months earlier on February 12th had gutted the sanctuary including the original large stained-glass window that had been installed in 1917 as a memorial dedicated to William Beall Hunt, the great-great nephew of Phineas Hunt.

According to newspaper coverage of the fire, the original 1917 window had depicted a landscape scene of mountains, rivers, fields, and trees. A significant change made during the church's restoration was the installation of stained-glass window new entitled "The Lost Sheep". Its unveiling in June of 1933 was part of Hunt's dedication service as well as the kickoff to the congregation's 160th anniversary celebration.

Information compiled the church for its 1933 June dedication service noted that the new window was created and installed by the Miller Art Studio located on North Howard Street in Baltimore. Recent research about this studio led descendant of the Miller family, Frank Miller of Art Glass Crafters



in Monkton. Though Frank no longer has any early business records available to him, he said that his grandfather Augustus Miller would have been the proprietor of the family business in 1933. He also noted that in the 1930's there would have been several artists painting for the shop. One early artist who did a lot of painting for the studio was Francis C. Fischer. Though unproven, it may likely be that Fischer was the artist of "The Lost Sheep" painting which was then rendered in stained glass.

This June 18, 2019 marks the 86th year that the Hunt's congregation has been enjoying this beautiful inspiring window that graces its pulpit.

(Note: Reverend John E. Holt was pastor at Hunt's in 1933. He served from 1929-1934)

We Want to Hear From You!

If you are a member or active supporter of Hunt's Church, the Church Council wants to hear from you. We are asking that you complete a brief survey (online or paper-based) on an important topic facing our church and the entire United Methodist denomination.



Background: The policy of the United Methodist Church denomination since 1972 is to welcome all LGBTQ+ individuals. However, the policy also prohibited "self-avowed practicing homosexuals" (language excerpted from the Book of Discipline) from being ordained for ministry and prohibited ordained ministers from officiating at same sex marriages. These prohibitions have been controversial since their adoption and the subject of ongoing debate within the denomination.

In an attempt to settle this issue, a Special Session of the General Conference was held in February of this year where competing plans were debated by delegates drawn from the entire worldwide denomination. After a series of votes on the different options, the current language, including the prohibitions referenced above, was approved, which essentially affirmed the current policy. Related adopted motions also included language to strengthen the penalties for clergy who violate the policy, including suspension and expulsion from the ministry. Another motion that passed permits churches who leave the denomination as a result of this policy to retain their assets (buildings, funds, etc.). These actions have caused many churches in the United States to debate where they stand on this decision and what the implications, if any, might be for their continued association with the UMC denomination.

We only want one submission per person, so please complete it only once. Please send paper responses to the church office (1912 Old Court Road, Towson, Maryland 21204). Please complete the survey as soon as possible as we want to analyze the responses by mid-June. Thank you.

2019 Financial Performance So Far – Still on Track, but Offerings are Trending the Wrong Way!

Here is our performance through the end of April:

Our results through the first four months of the year are tracking slightly better than budget, due in large part to careful expense management as you can see from the table above. Unfortunately, April's offerings were lower than expected, turning what had been a slightly positive result in income into one that is slightly negative for the year. As we move into what are traditionally our lowest months for offerings, I would ask that you challenge yourself to do what you can to increase our offerings. As you can see in the last column in the table, our budget reflects a shortfall of \$33,494 for the year, so I would ask you to continue praying for the financial health of our Church and how you can help us erase this shortfall.

Wouldn't it be great to celebrate breaking even when the end of the year arrives – what an accomplishment that would be! Being financially strong enables us to continue the many meaningful ministries of our church that impact not only our members but the communities in which we live. Thank you.


TRUSTEES CORNER



Baltimore County Christian Workcamp

The mission of the Baltimore County Christian Workcamp (BCCW) is to repair homes and provide assistance to limited income residents of Baltimore County by volunteers of all ages, primarily during one week in July. This is one of Hunt's oldest and biggest mission projects. Hunt's has participated since year one (i.e., 1984) and has been the base and host for BCCW since 1993.

BCCW's website is www.bcchristianworkcamp.org.

<u>Opportunities</u> to assist with BCCW, vary . . . some are the "normal" ways, whereas some are new. These vary in commitment and time, as well as the work environment. Some are in air-conditioned Hunt's and some are principally in your own home, albeit one also can be outdoors where the weather could be hot, humid, breezy, sunny, rainy, etc. (though on rare occasions it could be inside in an air conditioned building).

*Assist the meal coordinator (i.e., me) in coordinating/confirming with those churches or volunteers preparing meals at Hunt's or at their locations from July 21-26. (A matrix of who is doing what will be developed.)

*Donate something for the silent auction to be held on Sunday July 21. A photo or description is requested before July 12. The actual items can be delivered to me as late as 11:15 am on July 21.

Assist with setting up tables and chairs after the second service on Sunday July 21.

- *Assist with the silent auction on Sunday July 21 in Hunt's Nursery and 2s rooms with set-up, monitoring, and settling-up (3:00 pm-7:00 pm).
- *Prepare a side dish for the Sunday July 21 Kick-Off dinner at Hunt's and deliver by 5:00 pm. (The main dishes are BBQ and chili.)
- *Prepare a dessert for the Sunday July 21 dinner at Hunt's and deliver by 5:00 pm. (If, by chance, there are too many desserts, some will either be used in the auction or for volunteers' lunches during the week.)
- *Assist with setting-up for dinner by 5:00 pm on Sunday July 21 at Hunt's and cleaning-up after the dinner.

Attend the BCCW silent auction (and bid!) from 4:00 pm -6:30 pm on Sunday July 21 (cash or checks only) in Hunt's Nursery and 2s rooms.

- *Assist Jody Waters with breakfast on Monday July 22 (6:30 am-9:00 am) at Hunt's.
- *Assist one or more days at Hunt's during the mornings from Monday July 22 to Friday July 26 (6:30 am-9:00 am) setting out lunch staples and then cleaning-up.

Provide desserts for volunteers' lunches and deliver them before 7:00 am on Tuesday July 23.

*Volunteer for one or more days with the Hunt's BCCW team (or another team if their work site is at a "better" location within the County or has "better" work which needs to be done or even possibly has a "better" crew chief) from Monday July 22 to Friday July 26. Show up for dinner on Sunday or by 7:30 am during the week at Hunt's to register. (For information, see Crew Chief Glenn Keatts or me. We will be looking at a potential ramp work site in Pikesville, relatively close to Hunt's.)

Pray for a safe and productive experience for all of those involved. with BCCW.

*Note--Let us know if you can support Hunt's in one or more ways. We would like to know if you can help in order that we can plan better and to see what opportunities still need to be filled (as well as to avoid excessive volunteers, whether from Hunt's or other churches, which certainly would be a nice problem to have).

Kidder-Thomas Scholarship Fund

The Kidder-Thomas Scholarship Fund resulted from generous bequests under the wills of Sam Kidder and Jean Thomas. The sum has been invested along with subsequent donations, and the income earned from this investment is for scholarships for "worthy students who are members of Hunt's Church."

Trustees of the Fund will consider applications for scholarship aid each year. There are three trustees that oversee the fund: Chair of the Church Council (Ken Parrish), Chair of the Finance Committee (Ted Ochs), and Chair of the Board of Trustees (Rusty Erdman).

Applications must be received by June 30, 2019.

Additional applications are available at the Church Office. The completed application should be submitted along with an official transcript of high school or college grades, preferably through the spring of the current year.

Scholarships are for Hunt's congregation members who are undergraduate students enrolled full-time (12 credits or more per semester) and graduate students enrolled part-time or full time (6 credits or more per semester) in an accredited college or university in the United States.

In awarding scholarships, the Scholarship Trustees will primarily consider the applicants':

- Academic merit
- Financial need
- Church involvement and activities
- Community involvement and leadership

The total amount of scholarships available is the fund's earnings since last July. Generally, the awards have been in the range of \$250 to \$750. It is the Scholarship Trustees goal to meet and make their decisions in the month of July.

Applicants must make an annual application for each year of full time undergraduate or part or full time graduate status.

- 4. To renew scholarship, the above procedure must be repeated annually.
- 5. Completed application, student statement, and a current transcript of grades must be mailed to the Hunt's Church Office (1912 Old Court Road; Towson, MD 21204), Attn: Scholarship Committee, postmarked no later than June 30.
