

Grace to you and peace from Father, Son, and the Holy Ghost. God is not done with us yet, and it continues to be a joy to serve and pursue God together with you here in this place.

On October 20 we voted. 132 of our members came to help us determine what we believe God is calling us to do and be going forward, and committed themselves to this shared future together. The vote was decisive, which is a great blessing in that it frees us from continuing division and the need to relitigate this decision. 85% of us favor joining

the Reconciling Ministries Network to allow our protest against the General Conference's decision (in last February to maintain and support the 1972 language) to be visible to the community and world. This allows us to ask new and different questions as we live into this decision and continue to pursue God here at Hunt's.



First, we will need to recommit ourselves to ministry here. Since everyone eats, and the electric bills must be paid, we have to keep up the good work by pledging from the resources God gives us to keep doing the work of God here at Hunt's financially. Please know that we not only have a recent history of struggling to maintain our current ministry, with growing shortfalls each of the last two completed calendar years, but we also anticipate that this year will continue to be financially challenging for us. A great many wonderful things happen



here. They were worth doing in the past, continue to be worth doing now, and seem likely to be worth doing into the future. For that to happen, we need to keep the doors open, the lights on, and the staff eating.



God Loves a Cheerful Giver

Each of you should give what you have decided in your heart to give, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver. 2 Corinthians 9:7 (NIV)

When the calendar turns to November, we typically give thanks for all of the blessings God has bestowed on us. This year, I would also ask that you challenge yourself to become a Cheerful Giver. If we are honest with ourselves, we are often reluctant givers – jealously guarding our time, talents, and treasure. For this year's Stewardship Campaign, we will explore how we are to become what God wants for us – to be a Cheerful Giver.

The first step in becoming a Cheerful Giver is to stop focusing on what we perceive as something being lost – our time or money – when we give. We often talk about how love multiplies when we give it away, leaving both the giver and receiver enriched. Perhaps this also happens when we give of our time, talent, and treasure. What is more important – the quantity of time we have or the quality with which we live it? When we give money to God, do we dwell on how much less we have or do we think of what He can do with it? Economists often talk of the multiplier effect when money is put into the economy. Well, if this is true, then God is the Great Multiplier as the things He can do with our money are limitless.

The next step in becoming a Cheerful Giver is to focus on the impact our giving can have on others. I continue to marvel at the myriad of ways our church impacts our community – both within the church and also in the world. Just this past Sunday, Marcia Conlin kept me busy unpacking her car full of groceries that will help feed 50 families in our Food for Thought program – not only will these families have something to eat but their children will likely do better in school because they aren't distracted by the pain of hunger. When I see Jim Foster, I think of how he, with the support of the church and the Carroll's-Gill's Endowment Fund, helps students in the Baer School overcome the challenges life has given them. How can you see Ellie Lott and not think of all of the comfort she and others provide in the form of a prayer shawl to people recovering from an injury or illness, or Melissa Regan and the wonderful children we support all over the world, or Kelly Heubeck and the very successful Senior High Youth program that draws from the broader community (I must admit I also see her and think of the wonderful Turkey Dinner too). I could go on, but I hope you get the idea that if we focus on what our giving enables, then it is much easier to become a Cheerful Giver.

Finally, remembering that all that we have really belongs to God, who has provided it to us to benefit us and others, makes us realize that we are truly serving as stewards of His world. As such, giving some of what He has provided in order to support the church and the community it serves is just one more blessing from Him.

As we enter this Stewardship Campaign, my prayer for you is that you are able to discern God's will in how He wants you to support Hunt's Church with your time, talents, and treasure in 2020 and that the result is you become a Cheerful Giver. Thank you.



On Sunday, October 20, Hunt's UMC held a church conference to vote on becoming a Reconciling congregation.

As a reconciling congregation within the United Methodist Church, Hunt's Memorial UMC is a local church that publicly states that we welcome all persons, regardless of sexual orientation, gender identity, race or ethnicity, to participate fully* in our congregational life. In addition, our church affirms that we are created in the image of God and that all people are worthy of God's love and grace.

* fully - in principle, can mean ordination and marriage

One hundred thirty-two (132) church members signed-in to vote at the conference. One hundred twelve members (85%) voted in favor of becoming a reconciling church and twenty (15%) voted against becoming a reconciling church.

Our District Superintendent, Ann LaPrade, presided over the conference and supervised the vote.

Thank you for your prayerful consideration of this matter. We look forward to all church members continuing to actively engage in making Hunt's a welcoming vibrant community.

Here is our performance through the end of September:

Although our loss through nine months of the year is lower than what we expected (\$17,374 vs \$29,951), our monthly offerings are consistently trailing what was expected the last few months and are lower than they were last year through September. You can help us change that trend. Please consider increasing the amount you give each month to help us reduce the deficit. Larger than expected contributions from the Preschool program and tight expense management are helping us offset the reduction in offerings, but we can't count on that continuing to be the case as unexpected expenses can pop up at any time. In fact, some have – carpet replacement, boiler repairs, painting, etc.

As the end of the year approaches and the holiday season fills up our days, I ask that you challenge yourself to do what you can to increase your giving. If you give electronically, consider increasing the amount; if you give via cash, dig a little deeper into your purse or wallet; and if you give via a check, write it for a larger amount. Every bit will help. Our church and the communities we serve, both near and far, depend on our service and support. We have a great church that does so many wonderful things for so many people while also sustaining us as we face the challenges of life. Let's provide it with the financial resources to continue doing great things! Thank you.

Moment in Time...Thanksgiving Service 1993

In November 1993, following a morning Thanksgiving service, Hunt's congregation made a pilgrimage to the Hunt Family Graveyard. This pilgrimage was undertaken as part of the church's 220th anniversary celebration taking place that year, and to highlight the recent landscaping work done at the cemetery property.

Earlier in the fall, in honor of Hunt's anniversary year, then senior high church member, Mike Wellein, took on the task of cleaning up the graveyard which sadly had been neglected for a number of years. As part of his work for his Eagle Scout Badge, Mike and 10 members of Boy Scout Troop 729 of the Dulaney District spent 10 hours clearing underbrush, wild grapevines, ivy, honeysuckle and poison oak from the cemetery. Their efforts netted 173 giant-sized lawn bags and three truckloads of debris to be carted to the landfill. And, sorry to say, a number of cases of poison oak among the workers.

The Boy Scouts' "labor of love" if contracted for commercially at the time would have cost an estimated two to three thousand dollars. It was greatly appreciated and applauded as the perfect project to celebrate our congregation's rich heritage stretching back to 1773. At a later date, a special Sunday service and reception honoring Mike Wellein and Troop 729 was held at Hunt's.

Historical Note: The Hunt family cemetery is located between Old Court and Joppa Roads just west of Hunt's Church. It is located on what was once part of the homestead of Phineas Hunt, the founder of Hunt's congregation. Phineas, his wife Susannah, and many other family members are buried here. The first burial according to the stones appears to have been in 1772 with the last being 1867. The cemetery is approximately 60 feet by 40 feet with a stone wall surrounding it. It is entered by wooden steps over the west wall. On top of the south wall is a triangular white marble tablet which was erected circa 1915 by William Beall Hunt, a great-great nephew of Phineas. This triangular tablet records what was known at the time of the Hunt family's genealogy, beginning with Job Hunt who died in 1741 down to Samuel Hunt 2nd who died in 1896.


