To the saints currently unable to meet at Hunt's Memorial -

Grace to you and peace from God our Father, the Lord Jesus Christ, and the Holy Ghost who animates, guides, soothes, and comforts his people. Life is out of sorts in ways that were hard to image only a short time ago. A disease, that the CDC models project may kill between 200,000 and 1.7 million Americans this year, stalks our streets. Our leaders, both religious and governmental, tell us to stay home and not give this disease ways to transmit itself between us.

A lot about this new disease is not well known, and most of us would not know how to determine how worried we should be without expert guidance regardless. In my lifetime, in my parents' lifetime, in the living memory of my extended family, I cannot remember ever even hearing of a time when our Churches were asked to close en masse to protect our community.

The stock market has fallen, as of today, roughly 30% from its recent highs. For those among us who live on the returns from our accumulated funds from our working years, this isn't merely worrisome, it is potentially catastrophic and life changing.

This is a time when the vaunted powers of science, technology, innovation, and our incredible understanding and manipulation of our world around us may seem a bit more hollow than they might have only a few weeks ago. When all around us trembles – when the world we thought we knew demonstrably is not quite what we had thought it was – when microscopic mostly not alive viruses tear down aspects of our lives we had imagined unassailable, whence cometh our help?

Psalm 121:1-2, KJV: I will lift up mine eyes unto the hills, from whence cometh my help.

My help cometh from the Lord, which made heaven and earth. (the rest of this Psalm is worth reading as well)

Psalm 91:1-6, KJV: He that dwelleth in the secret place of the most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the Lord, He is my refuge and my fortress: my God; in him will I trust. Surely, he shall deliver thee from the snare of the fowler, and from the noisome pestilence. He shall cover thee with his feathers, and under his wings shalt thou trust: his truth shall be thy shield and buckler. God promises us that nothing whatsoever, not disease, not economic disaster, not political conflict or our inability to control and dominate all areas of our lives, not even worship at a distance can separate us from the love of God who is as present with us in our living rooms as in our sanctuary. Now is the time to remember the promises of God – I urge you, take a few minutes in your home to read from the Psalms and other parts of the Bible everyday while you are at home. Let God's word bring God's promises into your living room and home. Let God's love flow from the pages of God's word fill your hearts and lives. Then this will indeed be a Holy Lent.

Easter?

As we work on this newsletter, it is entirely unclear what kind of worship service, if any, we can hold in our sanctuary for Palm Sunday, Holy Week services, or even Easter.

Our Bishop has announced plans for a conference-wide webcast service on Easter. Our worship team is discussing our own options – at the very least we will continue to perfect our internet-based services (sound level improvements coming soon). It is almost certainly the case that the numbers of infections and capacity of our hospitals' ICUs will drive the decisions to remain in lockdown or to loosen the chains and allow our people to gather as we have become accustomed. Certainly, in the meantime we can pray for our neighbors and those who are sickened. Lockdown is uncomfortable, but those who deal with illness and those who care for the sick in these days are surely much more than uncomfortable. Our prayers for them are well warranted.

Moments in Time...1973, 1974

Over the course of 1973-1974, a new educational wing including a fellowship hall and a new larger kitchen was added onto Hunt's Church. The completed project was consecrated on Sunday, May 12, 1974. The groundbreaking ceremony for the new wing had taken place just 10 months earlier on July 10, 1973. Among our church files is a typed report that describes the laying of the cornerstone for the new wing, the cornerstone box, and the contents placed within it. The box is described as a stainless steel, water-tight box furnished by Dr. Gordon Filbey. Inside the box were placed certain items by various groups of the church. The author (unknown) of this report included the following commentary on the event:

"Although they will be viewed in a different light by future generations, to the present members of Hunt's Church these items represent something special that has happened in the past year. For the country, the past year will be remembered for a gas shortage, for Watergate, for the threatened impeachment of the President (and perhaps actual impeachment), and for corruption at all levels of government. For the people of Hunt's Church, the past year will be remembered as the year in which Hunt's celebrated its 200th anniversary, and of course as the year this building was completed. Most of the items in this box will be related to these two events, plus the recording of the names of the members of the groups."

According to the report, the 16 items noted below were placed in the cornerstone box:

- 1. <u>A list of the present members of Hunt's Church</u>
- 2. <u>A booklet containing the 1974 budget and committee members</u>
- 3. Today's church Bulletin
- 4. A brief history of Riderwood, Hunt's Church, and the Hunt Family Graveyard
- 5. <u>From the Adult Bible Class: The current lesson material entitled "A Distinct People" and a favorite hymn, "Brighten the Corner Where You Are"</u>
- 6. From the sewing circle: A list of members and a rain bonnet
- 7. From the Junior High Youth: a newsletter and a hockey ticket
- 8. <u>From the United Methodist women: A brochure containing a brief history of the group, current members, and the program for the year</u>
- 9. From the children's choir: A program from the 1974 Spring Concert
- 10. From the Senior Choir: Copies of two favorite anthems
- 11. From the Senior High Youth: A program from a recent worship service on "Time" presented by the group
- 12. A recently prepared pamphlet about Hunt's Church
- 13. The Bicentennial Anniversary Program
- 14. Photographs from the Bicentennial Picnic
- 15. News clippings related to the Bicentennial
- 16. Minutes of the meeting approving the new educational building and a news clipping of the ground-breaking ceremony

The construction was done by Andrew Building Company in conjunction with architect Mark Beck. The chairman of the Church building committee was Hunt's member, James Miller. The estimated cost of the addition was \$\$120,000.

Note: Reverend Edward VanMetre was pastor in 1974 at the time of this cornerstone laying. He was at Hunt's from 1969-1983. The current fellowship hall (VanMetre Hall) was part of a later addition completed in 1987. It was later dedicated in memory of Reverend VanMetre.

While the income for the first two months is strong, we can't forget it is largely due to some donations of stock we received in January. As this was anticipated when developing the budget, you can see that we are actually running behind our plan in terms of income. Our weekly offerings are trailing last year and our budget. Fortunately, some of our expenses are running below budget as well, thus offsetting some of the impact of the lower giving.

Obviously, the impact to our Sunday worship services from the coronavirus situation is a real threat to our financial situation. Please consider giving electronically during the time that we are not able to meet in person. You'll find an article with information about how to do it elsewhere in this newsletter. Since most of our expenses are fixed in the short run (salaries, maintenance, etc.), we need to do what we can to continue supporting the church in these challenging times. While I am concerned about the current situation, I do want to reassure you that through faithful giving in the past, the church does have the resources to weather this storm, so please know Hunt's will continue to serve the Lord in our community for years to come. Hopefully, we can avoid using these reserves, but they are there if we need them.

How to Give When You Aren't Able to Attend Sunday Worship

On any given Sunday, 80% of the weekly offering is received by checks and cash placed in the offering plate passed by an usher. 20% is received electronically via funds contributed via the church's online offering vehicle, both from recurring and one-time donations. Since our costs are fixed in the short term, losing 80% of our offerings while our church building is closed is a real concern. As a recent convert to online giving, I can attest to how easy it is. Even if you prefer to give in-person, I would urge you to use electronic giving while our building is locked. For those who give electronically already, I would ask that you consider increasing your giving via a one-time gift or increasing your regular gift. You will find the electronic giving link on our website (www.huntsumc.org) by navigating to the "Stewardship" tab and clicking on "My Offering". This will take you to a site where you can create an account or give without creating an account.

Another way to keep giving during this time is to mail a check to the church office (1912 Old Court Road, Towson, MD 21204). Beth is in the office and will go through the mail on a daily basis.



Hunt's Church has faced many challenges during its 248-year history. Clothing Shed

I probably should have placed this article in the March Point; notwithstanding, I wanted to let those know who acted on my request to comment on the introduced Bill 3-20 on donation bins located within Baltimore County that the bill was extensively amended before it was voted on at the County Council meeting on February 18. The approved version appears to address virtually all of my concerns, as well as our clothing shed provider's issues. I am sure that what we did helped to convince the County Council that there needed to be some revisions in order to make the bill more reasonable and viable. I did discover that the main impetus for the bill was that some bin locations became mini-dump sites for all sorts of waste and they were not being cleaned up, plus bins were sometimes placed without the property owner's permission and bins were not removed promptly when requested. The bill has more teeth in it now to address these types of problems, without getting into excessive additional regulations.




Phone Buddies ?
